Health and Safety Statement

WBC will provide information, instruction, supervision and training considered necessary to use the church facilities. Staff and volunteers are asked to request extra training if they are still unsure on how to use the facilities safely. Staff and volunteers are responsible for their own safety and the safety of those in groups they are leading, and they are encouraged to influence all who use the premises to share WBC's commitment to a healthy and safe environment.

This statement, along with the full Health and Safety Policy, will be reviewed regularly and revised as necessary.
